CONSENT MOTION TO EXTEND THE TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND RESCHEDULE THE PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION HEARING

Plaintiff, the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC"), requests that: (1) the *Ex Parte* Temporary Restraining Order ("TRO") be extended until July 17, 2018; and (2) the preliminary injunction hearing be rescheduled to 1:30 p.m. on July 17, 2018. All defendants and the Receiver consent to the extension of the TRO and the rescheduling of the preliminary injunction hearing.

The FTC filed suit on June 4, 2018 (Doc. No [1]). On June 5, 2018, the Court entered the TRO (Doc. No [12]), and on June 7, 2018, the Court extended the TRO until June 26, 2018 (Doc. No. [16]). The parties now request that the Court extend the TRO until July 17, 2018, and reschedule the preliminary injunction hearing to take place that day at 1:30 p.m.

Good cause exists to extend the TRO and reschedule the preliminary injunction hearing. Due to the volume of materials filed in this action, defendants have requested additional time to familiarize themselves with the matter and prepare for the preliminary injunction hearing. All parties agree that the TRO should remain in effect until the

preliminary injunction hearing takes place.

All defendants and the Receiver consent to the relief requested in this Motion. Specifically, counsel for defendants Russell Whitney and preliminary counsel for Susan Zanghi consent to the extension of the TRO and rescheduling of the preliminary injunction hearing on behalf of their respective clients. Defendant Matthew Lloyd McPhee and the corporate defendants have not yet retained counsel, but Mr. McPhee is currently in discussions with attorneys to secure representation in this matter. One of those attorneys has represented to the FTC that Mr. McPhee and each of the corporate defendants consents to extension of the TRO and rescheduling of the preliminary injunction hearing to July 17.
